

**Dr. Jim Malatras** was named the 14th chancellor of The State University of New York on August 21, 2020. Prior to his role leading the SUNY system, Dr. Malatras served as the fifth president of SUNY

Empire State College. Prior to joining SUNY Empire in May 2019, he served as president of the Rockefeller Institute of Government, where he led the Institute's modernization effort to offer policymakers evidence-based policy analysis and recommendations on timely topics. Dr. Malatras has held several high-ranking positions in New York State government, including director of state operations to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, where he managed the dayto-day operation of state government and served as the administration's point person on policy development and implementation.



Prior to his appointment as Chancellor, **Dr. Matos Rodríguez** was president of CUNY's Queens College from 2014 to 2019 and of CUNY's Eugenio María de Hostos Community College in the Bronx

from 2009 to 2014, making him one of a select few U.S. educators who has led both a baccalaureate and a community college. A member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Chancellor sits on the governing board of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU). In 2021, he joined the board of the Association for a Better New York (ABNY) and was named co-chair of the New York City Regional Economic Development Council (NYCREDC). In 2020, the Chancellor was named by the American Council on Education (ACE) to a national task force focused on improving transfer of credit practices and to New York City's Education Sector Advisory Council.





1. Co-Designing an Integrated Accelerated
Pathways Model with Employers and the
Workforce Development System: Driving System
Changes through the CUNY Community Colleges
Consortium

Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grant Program. The Consortium will present an overview of the project, framework, theory of change, and strategies proposed to implement systemic changes within CUNY Workforce Development. The Consortium will also report the up-to-date progress.

#### Takeaways:

- (1) actively engage employers through partnerships with industry to enhance career pathways and revise policies to support work-based learning
- (2) develop and implement pedagogical practices supporting online and culturally responsive teaching through faculty/staff professional development
- (3) design training programs that will enable workers to reskill as quickly as possible with industry-recognized credentials and accelerated pathways to degrees that include credit for prior learning

## 2. Ninja Marketing to Capture Leads and Convert to Sales

Presenter: Fern Chan, John Jay College of Criminal Justice

Learn the stealth moves that successful businesses and entrepreneurs use to convert leads into sales that can be applied to our continuing education model. This session will give you a behind-the-scenes look on how to capture emails, what to do with the information once you get it, and the necessary follow-up to nurture that lead into a sale.

#### Takeaways:

- (1) How to create value-added lead magnets to increase your subscribers
- (2) How to automate the follow-up sequence to save you time
- (3) Provide a VIP user experience that leads to conversion

#### 3. Modern Racial Dynamics

#### **Presenters:**

Tyre Bush, SUNY Corning Community College Marcus Brooks, "Let's Brainstorm" Consulting

This session will walk the participants through one administrators' approach to addressing systemic challenges within her region and the steps she took in doing so. We will discuss the thought process, actions, and the outcome of tackling what some consider to be a very challenging subject matter in a very challenging time

#### Takeaways:

- (1) Finding those with personal experience & intestinal fortitude to facilitate such conversations is not easy at all
- (2) However, the right facilitator/instructor can be worth their weight in gold
- (3) Intelligent & capable facilitators/instructors only want to show up for those who are willing to do the work and who are not interested in checking a box or serving as window dressing

#### 4. Creating Pathways To High-Potential Jobs For Low-Income New Yorkers

#### **Presenter:**

Karrin Wilks. NY Jobs Council

This presentation will provide an overview of the work of the New York Jobs CEO Council, a new non-profit dedicated to advancing the economic prosperity of low-income New Yorkers. Key overall strategies include active collaboration between education and business, better student preparation for the future of work, and changes in company recruitment and hiring processes. Participants will learn about first-year Jobs Council initiatives and early findings, and have the opportunity to discuss how to break down industry and educational silos and open the door to local talent.

#### 5. Building a Skilled Manufacturing Pipeline for NY: **How Workforce Education is Changing Post-Pandemic**

#### **Presenters:**

Barbara Reer, SUNY Ulster

Johnnieanne Hasen, The Council of Industry of Southeastern NY Eileen Larocca, Howmet Fastening Systems

In order to attract students into workforce training programs, colleges need to look deeply at what matters to those in the community. New pathways have been initiated and supported by SUNY System but embracing them can be a challenge. Using Advanced Manufacturing as an example, we will look at non-credit to credit articulations, Micro-Credentials and Apprenticeships and how these initiatives can grow enrollments and create a pipeline of talent for local employers. The presentation will also look at challenges these initiatives present to campuses and some solutions to those challenges.

#### Takeaways:

- (1) Understand how to build education pathways for today's student
- (2) Learn how apprenticeships can be an answer to filling the manufacturing pipeline
- (3) Understand how partnerships are key in helping the economy

#### 6. Future InSight - Career Pathways Model for Non-credit to Credit programming

#### **Presenters:**

Christine Zagari-LoPorto, Kingsborough CC Ada Rosales, Bounce Marketing

KCC secured grant funding from Capital One for a research project designed to answer one fundamental question: 'How do we better align credit and noncredit programs to better respond to local employer demands and reduce the skills gap?' The results revealed that, on a whole, KCC's Continuing Education students felt disengaged from their larger college community. In response, the leadership of KCC decided there had to be a practical, scalable and cost-effective approach to meet students' career counseling needs. KCC hired Bounce Marketing & Consulting to execute its vision. Bounce created a site that is high on visual appeal and easy to navigate, specifically for students whose first language is not English. Future InSight is a one-stop shop for adults seeking guidance on their next career move at KCC.

#### Takeaways:

- (1) Understand on how to take current non-credit pathways and connect them to credit pathways at their institutions
- (2) How to create maps for students so they can 'see' where their certifications could lead
- (3) How to utilize free open source data sites, like O\*Net, for keeping information provided to students up to date and relevant

- (1) Effectively think about how can we change/modify/ update the cultural paradigm of our campuses, in order to reach out to disadvantaged communities and provide them with the support they will need to successfully pursue micro-credentials towards green career programs?
- (2) Form strategies for effectively working with industry and labor to advance green careers, beyond ongoing discussions and meetings

- (2) Understand how to use a conceptual framework, that is nimble and responsive to unify stakeholders

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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
