Free Welding Classes at MVCC

Mohawk Valley Community College recently targeted unemployed individuals in a free welding and air conditioning training program that ended with great success on July 15.

A cohort of 20 students successfully completed the eight-week program. Before the program concluded, 4 students were offered jobs and a significant 8 students are pursuing higher education with 4 enrolled and 2 applying at MVCC. The other students are actively obtaining job search assistance from MVCC, the local Working Solutions, and MVCC's Educational Opportunity Center, which offers job guidance. Through the skills training of this innovative program, MVCC provided individuals with the gateway to placement in successful careers. welding and air conditioning training program that ended with great success on July 15.

The Federal Identity Theft “Red Flag” Rules and New York's Higher Education Institutions

Several federal agencies jointly issued a new set of regulations intended to help prevent, detect, and mitigate **identity theft**. The rules apply to financial institutions and *creditors* — a term that is defined to include public and private service providers that allow their clients to defer payment for services. This definition includes colleges that allow their students to pay for services at a later date. You may want to ask your institution's business office about these rules. Not implementing a written plan may create liability and possible civil monetary penalties. Learn more at:
