

Trends in Prior Learning Assessment

Presenters: Nan Travers, Ashley Frank, Alyssa Vine

Over the past few years, CUNY and SUNY have engaged in efforts to improve credit and noncredit alignment through Prior Learning Assessment (PLA), with the belief that if an individual begins their time at college on the noncredit side and then decides to move into a degree plan on the credit side, the work completed on the noncredit side should be recognized. This panel will focus on the following: 1) Case making: the why we engage in PLA, the philosophy and the policy; 2) Trust: with colleagues, with faculty and with students; 3) Quality: how we ensure quality and integrate that into our PLA policy; 4) Consistency: learning outcomes are the same across non-credit and credit; 5) Equity: how do we use PLA to ensure that all people have equal opportunities in higher education; and 6) Recognition: credentials, credits, etc. Panelists will discuss PLA trends from national projects, CUNY and SUNY systems and will offer insights about the future of Prior Learning Assessment. With the recent addition of non-credit TAP funding, this transition from non-credit to credit becomes even more important. We will hear from NYS experts in this field and you will have a chance to ask questions.

Dr. Nan Travers, Director, Center for Leadership in Credentialing Learning at SUNY Empire State College,



focuses on research, policies and practices of the recognition, validation, and credentialing of learning. Currently, she is the PI for a U.S. Department of Education grant Credential As You Go: Transforming the Credentialing System of the U.S., which researches the Incremental Credentialing Framework's six strategies for recognizing and credentialing learning.

Ashley Frank, Project Coordinator, Center for Leadership in Credentialing Learning, SUNY Empire



State College, leads work across the three states within the U.S. Department of Education grant Credential As You Go: Transforming the Credentialing System of the U.S. She is also the project coordinator for a sub

award for a Lumina Foundation grant REACH, which is exploring learning recognition and credentialing from an equity and inclusion lens, and was the lead for activities within the Lumina Foundation grant, All Learning Counts.

Alyssa Vine, University Director of Credit for Prior Learning in CUNY's Office of Academic Affairs. In this



role she leads the university's
Office of Credit for Prior
Learning, which provides policy
and procedure guidance and
supports CUNY's colleges in
their work to award academic
credit for learning acquired

outside of the college classroom.

The State of Workforce Development in New York

Our current age of disruption in a semi-post pandemic world presents opportunities for the workforce development field and current policy infrastructure for education and training to meet the rapidly changing needs of workers and employers. New York State has responded with equally swift transformation of their own to prepare the workforce of today and the one that is needed for the future. With lofty goals to build a statewide ecosystem that promotes continuous lifelong learning, research and innovation, equity, and transformation and partnerships; investing in an agile, technologically resilient workforce; and enabling every worker to participate in the workforce of the future through comprehensive support, will help fill gaps and create alignment in our education and training programs to combat inequities and strengthen access to quality learning and employment opportunities. CEANY will bring together workforce development leaders from New York State Department of Labor, Empire State Development, and NYATEP for a discussion focusing on New York State's investment in workforce development. Our conversation will cover new funding opportunities, data and research, advocacy and policy, and future developments.

Megan Farry is the Director of Strategic Partnerships at the New York Association of Training and Employment



Professionals (NYATEP). In this role, she works to support and connect workforce resources throughout the Western New York region, as well as develop and execute NYATEP's professional development initiatives

through LEVELUP NY. Megan is a seasoned marketing and communications professional with experience spanning a variety of industries including real estate, manufacturing, and multi-national workforce solution firms. She holds a Communications degree from the State University of New York College at Fredonia.

Chris White has worked for New York State since 2012, previously leading the Department of Labor's



Communications Office and later serving as Director of Communications for then-Lieutenant Governor Kathy Hochul. He has been extensively involved in workforce development policy and has

overseen several major statewide outreach and

education campaigns including \$15 minimum wage, closing the gender wage gap, subminimum wage and workplace sexual harassment prevention. In his current role, he focuses on updating workforce development systems and policy and monitoring trends in the workforce, working to modernize how we train workers for the jobs of tomorrow.

Amber Rangel joined Empire State Development (ESD) in August 2022 and serves as the Vice President



and Director of Workforce
Development to lead the newly
created Office of Strategic
Workforce Development, part of
Governor Kathy Hochul's \$350
million investment in workforce
development. Currently, Amber

is leading the launch of a \$150 million grant program focused on industry-driven workforce development and programs serving historically marginalized communities. Prior to joining ESD, Amber served as the Director of Workforce Development at The Business Council of New York State where she led the organization's advocacy and programs supporting a broad range of education and workforce development issues.






